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
CRC Screening Before COVID-19

Formal population screening programmes performed well in few countries / regions, e.g.:

- Slovenia
- The Netherlands
- Basque region (Spain)

But, for many countries there was no data

Only 14% of EU citizens 50–74 years old have the opportunity to participate in a formal population-based CRC screening programme

Disruption of the CRC Screening Programmes

- Increase in the number of late stage cancers
- Increase in the number of CRC deaths
- May have a higher impact in the older age groups





CRC Screening and COVID-19

- Some countries already managed to clear it

- Effective communication reaching out to the target population

The Way Forward

Health of the population should be a priority
