ROADMAP FOR IMPROVING ACCESS TO CCR SCREENING IN SPAIN


With the aim of increasing the participation in the regional screening programs for colorectal cancer early detection, a working group has been created made up of health specialists as well as a patient organization. Six meetings have been held among others with the Deputy Ministry of Health Care and Public Health and the General Director of Public Health.

Areas for improvement identified.


- Improvements in the diagnostic process

White Paper on CRC Screening in Spain



One of the most relevant aspects of a CRC screening program is its multidisciplinary nature with the participation of different health professionals who must act in coordination.

Thus, specialists in Public Health, Digestive System and Primary Care, and specialists in Laboratory, Pathological Anatomy, Surgery and Oncology are included. Together with doctors, the participation of nursing and health managers is essential for the success of these programs. Last but not least, is the participation of citizens that requires a prior task of awareness and training.

GOAL

The goal of this project is to analyze the organization and activity of CRC screening programs carried out in Spain, describe their challenges and opportunities and carry out a strategic analysis with proposals for action

DESIGN

The project will be developed in three phases:

- 1. Collection, review and synthesis of information.
- 2. Strategic analysis and proposal of lines and objectives.
